

## REGIONS, ZONES AND DEALERS

Subject: United States Government Parts Contract TS-13627

The Packard Motor Car Company has entered into the subject contract with the U. S. Government to supply stipulated classes of parts and accessories. The contract contains the following provisions:

The Packard Motor Car Company agrees to furnish motor vehicle parts and accessories, gasoline engines parts and accessories at the following prices:

- (1) Parts included in the "Trade Net" Supplement to the #39 Parts and Accessories Price List at trade net prices signified by the hollow square symbol.
- (2) Other parts coded AA at 25% from current list price.
- (3) Slower moving parts (all other codes) at 10% from current list price.

Contract orders may be placed with any authorized Packard dealer provided that dealer is willing and in a position to handle such orders according to the terms and conditions enumerated in this bulletin. Any dealer's participation is entirely on a voluntary and cooperative basis.

If Packard dealers are unable to handle orders on the Government contract for any reason, or if the Government agency or establishment so desires, the orders may be placed with the nearest Packard Zone Parts Warehouse, Packard Distributer Parts Warehouse or Packard Factory Parts Warehouse. On orders received by the Packard Factory Parts Warehouse, Packard reserves the right to forward such orders to a Zone or Distributer Warehouse for handling. There are certain other phases which should be understood by the Zone organization. These are enumerated herewith:

- A. The contract TS-13627 covers the period between January 15, 1949, through October 31, 1949, only. This period may later be extended.
- B. The factory has supplied the Treasury Department, Bureau of Federal Supply, with fifteen copies of Parts and Accessories

Price List #39, dated May 1, 1949, together with the Trade Net Supplement to Price List #39. According to Amendment #614 of the Federal Supply Schedule, dated March 18, 1949, the Government has now agreed with the following: "It is understood that the prices to be charged will be those in effect on the date of shipment. Copies of list price changes and/or supplements thereto are to be mailed as soon as possible direct to the Government agencies holding manufacturer's parts price list." Inasmuch as the factory is fulfilling this part of the obligation, each Zone can process Government orders against this contract in the usual manner.

- C. Purchase orders which embody the terms and conditions of the subject contract will be issued by any of the participating Government agencies to effect their individual procurement requirements. Payments will be made by the ordering office.
- D. Scope of the contract provides for the mandatory use of the same by certain Government agencies and for voluntary use by others. In the case of the voluntary agencies, Packard may honor these orders, with the understanding that if such orders are not returned within ten days after receipt thereof, the failure to return the orders shall constitute acceptance thereof by Packard. Zones will be advised regarding which Government agencies are participating on a mandatory basis. Since the word "Packard" as above used includes dealer, it is important that non-accepted orders be promptly rejected within the specified time.

It is the desire that the Packard Zone and dealer organizations recognize the intent of the contract and contribute every effort to its successful fulfillment. You are requested to become thoroughly familiar with the conditions and act accordingly.
