Subject: PRECAUTIONS TO ELIMINATE REPEATED GLASS BREAKAGE

When it is necessary to change a door window glass because of breakage, a thorough inspection of the channels, runways, etc., should be made to prevent a recurrence.

In many cases a broken window is renewed without removing the trim panel to make an investigation of the cause of breakage. As a result the new window may break causing an added expense and customer dissatisfaction.

Before installing a new glass, check the runways for high rivets, clips, etc., and the channels for proper spacing and attachment at the lower end. Check the tie bar across the bottom of the channels to be sure that it is not bent and that it is properly attached to the channels. Be sure that the stops are properly located and are securely tightened. These precautions will reduce the possibility of repeated breakage.
