Subject: UPHOLSTERY WATER SPOTS

Certain types of upholstery, having what is termed as a "face-finish", are susceptible to having a stained appearance when spotted with water.


"Face-finished" cloth is a material which has the pile or nap ironed over and flattened in one direction. When spotted with water, the pile or nap over the spotted areas will stand upright. Although the spotted areas will show a change in color, they are not actually stained.

Having all of the pile or nap stand upright will remove the discolored areas and reduce discoloration if the cloth is again water spotted.

The recommended method to raise the pile is to use a solution of 1 oz. of upholstery cleaner, part number 410283, to 1 gallon of water. The entire cushion or back should be thoroughly and evenly wetted with the solution and allowed to dry. Do not use a vacuum cleaner for drying. The cleaner is added to provide a means for spreading the solution evenly and does not act as a cleaning agent.

The drying time can be shortened by using a solution of 1 gallon of water and 1 gallon of colorless, denatured alcohol and 2 oz. of upholstery cleaner, part number 410283. Do not use any anti-freeze alcohol.
