## Gentlemen:

We have often received inquiries from distributers and dealers regarding the advisability of using steel expanders behind the piston rings in order to remedy piston slaps.

Expanders of this kind are effective in correcting slaps, but the usual objection to their use in the past has been that the springs have been so stiff that the wall pressures of the piston rings have built up to an excessive point and rapid cylinder wear has been the result.

The Ramsey Accessories Manufacturing Company of St. Louis, Mo., manufacture the Ramco Inner Cushion Ring, and this ring is not open to the objection of excessive pressure. It will be found after inserting the inner ring back of the first and second piston rings that the piston will operate in the cylinder practically as freely as before, and yet the pressure will be found sufficient to take care of piston slaps.
