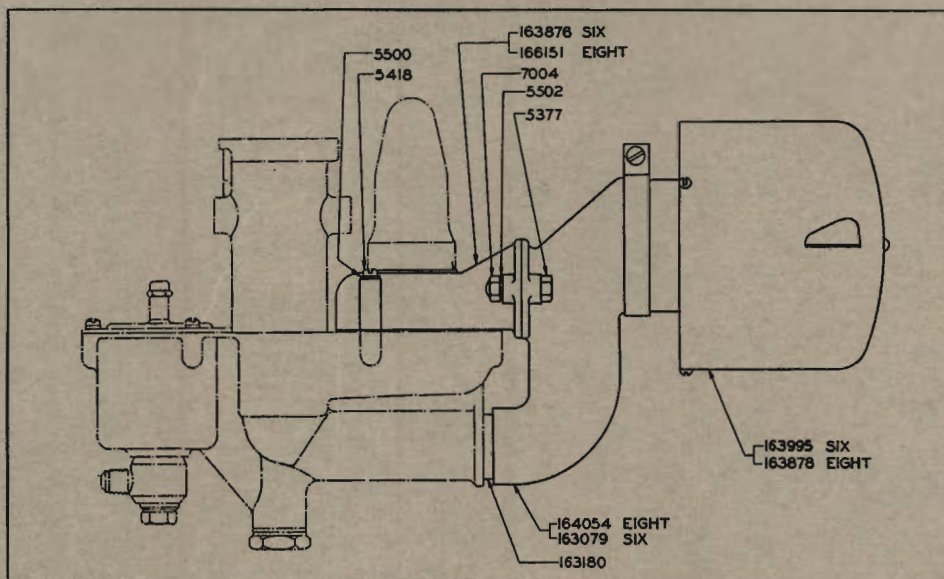

Subject: Carburetor Air Cleaner.

TO BE NOTED AND INITIALED BY



From time to time we have received requests for an air cleaner which could be attached in service to the present carburetor.

When a car is operated under such conditions that a considerable amount of road dust is encountered an air cleaner will improve the condition of the crankcase oil and will increase the life of the cylinders, pistons and rings. The illustration shows the equipment which has been developed for this purpose.

The equipment may be ordered as follows:

0163875 Motor Carburetor Air Cleaner Equipment (426, 526, 626)

0164826 Motor Carburetor Air Cleaner Equipment (343, 443, 640)

Each of these equipments will be sold for \$6.00 net, and the zone prices will be \$10.00, \$10.50 and \$11.60 for the first, second and third zones respectively.

The manner of attachment is clearly illustrated. The old air valve is mounted in the new seat and at the bottom connection a steel ferrule is used to make a slip joint between the carburetor body and the air cleaner casting.
