Gentlemen:

In some of the current model cars you will find that the vibration of the gear shifter lever in the intermediate speeds sets up an objectionable noise.

The noise may be eliminated by slipping over the lower end of the lever a coiled spring to which a hardened washer is attached. The washer is mounted on the lower end of the spring and bears against the gear shifter shafts so that it dampens out the movement of the lower end of the lever in the notches of the shafts.
